Celebrating birdlife with BC, TTFNC

TRINIDAD and Tobago is very biodiverse when it comes to birds with just over 470 bird species being recorded. This includes approximately 227 year-round resident species and 168 regular seasonal



migrants, approximately 50 species are listed as wanderers or vagrants.

BirdsCaribbean (BC) is a regional NGO that comprises a diverse community of people working for a sustainable future for the region through preservation of birds and their habitats. One of these efforts is to increase awareness and appreciation of the

region's unique bird life through an annual Caribbean Endemic Bird Festival (CEBF). The theme of the 2016 festival is "Spread your wings for bird conservation". TTFNC has been involved with BC over the last eight years with the CEBF in order to raise peo-

ples' care and concern about birds. The festival celebrates the exceptionally high endemism in the region - 173 species of birds call the Caribbean home and which are found nowhere else in the world. TTFNC Continues to page 6B

Join in conservation of our birds

TT has two endemic birds: the pawi or Trinidad piping-guan (Pipile pipile) and the Trinidad motmot (Momotus bahamensis).

These endemic birds are unique examples of the Caribbean's

natural heritage, and they often occupy specialised niches in the ecology of the islands where they live. This year's theme raised awareness about the different laws and programmes that protect our unique birds and how everyone can participate in activities

that help safeguard their long-term survival.

The Trinidad and Tobago Field Naturalists' Club (TTFNC) is a society for the study of natural history, and is one of the oldest clubs existing in TT. This year the club celebrates 125 years and

is celebrating biodiversity including bird diversity.

This May there was a CEBF talk at the monthly meeting of the TTFNC as well as a talk on bird diversity and various activities at the Green Market in Santa Cruz.

The TTFNC also

raises awareness of birds and bird habitats by monthly bird trips and sometimes displays such as that of TTFNC held at the National Museum in May and June this year.

In May, the bird group walked the Cumuto Rail Line, flanking the Aripo Savanna and saw the area's specialities including sulphury flycatcher (*Tyrannopsis sulphurea*) and red-bellied macaws (*Orthopsittaca manilatus*). And, in June the club overnighted on Monos Island where the overnights heard mysterious nocturnal bird calls (believed to be that of rufous nightjar (*Antrostomus rufus*)).

The TTFNC is also affiliated with the Trinidad and Tobago Bird Status and Distribution Committee (TTBSDC).

This committee evaluates reports of birds with the aim of converting them into documented records that can be used reliably for scientific studies of bird distribution and patterns of avian vagrancy. TTFNC is also affiliated with the TT Bird Alert forum which disseminates news on birds to enthusiastic birders.

Finally, the TTFNC also publishes quarterly bulletins and a yearly scientific journal which seeks to bring local knowledge of natural history (including birds) both

to academics and the interested layman. So if you are interested in knowing or helping our bird, perhaps you may wish to become a part of the TTFNC today.

We each have a part to play in the conservation of our birds and all other aspects of our natural environment. Let's step up to the challenge and do something positive for our environment now.
