COMPETITION RULES

- The entry **must be the student's own original work** and idea.
- Eligible media include: Poster paints, watercolours, gouache, acrylics, chalk pastels, oil pastels, coloured pencils, crayons, pencil, inks, felt pens, charcoal. If you are unsure about a medium that isn't listed here, please contact the club at admin@ttfnc.org to check.
- Photography is not eligible for this competition.
- The size of artwork should be no larger than 60cm x 90cm (24"x 36") and no smaller than 20cm x 25cm (8"x 10").
- Artwork should be mounted on black Bristol or other board with a 5cm (2") border all around.
- Children should enter the category according to the age that they are on the 1st May 2016.
- Artists are required to complete the entry form and stick it securely to the back of their artwork.
- Entries and accompanying entry forms must be received at the collection centres before midnight on the 30th June 2016.
- Winning entries become the property of the Trinidad and Tobago Field Naturalists' Club (TTFNC). Full credit will be given to the winners in all displays and reproductions.
- Non-winning submissions may be collected by the artists at the end of the competition on request.
- By entering the competition, artists and their parents/guardians grant their permission for winning artwork to be displayed by the TTFNC at various events during the 125th Anniversary year, and reproduced in Club publications (with full credit to the winners).
